Roundtables at the COP29 Virtual Ocean Pavilion



One of the key goals of the Virtual Ocean Pavilion is to engage ocean and climate enthusiasts from around the world and allow those unable to attend COP29 in-person a chance to understand emerging issues in the ocean-climate-biodiversity nexus and share their opinions on how we can come together to

generate solutions. In support of this commitment, the Virtual Ocean Pavilion Team has launched a new feature this year: roundtable discussions.

These will be held during the live days of the Pavilion (6, 11, 12, 18, 21 November) and will provide a space for small-group discussions where ideas on how to promote the key messages of the Pavilion and address other ocean-climate-biodiversity themes will be equally exchanged by participants. Four roundtables will be organized by collaborating partners to explore the following themes through an ocean and climate lens:

- Blue Finance, organized by the University of the South Pacific
- Strategic Communication, organized by Communications INC
- Gender, organized by the Pavilion for People
- Cross-sectoral Governance, organized by the Global Ocean Forum

African Development Bank grants loan of over €24 million to improve fisheries and aquaculture sectors


A new initiative by the African Development Bank



The Board of Directors of the African Development Bank Group approved a loan of €24.63 million to Côte d'Ivoire to boost the development of fisheries and aquaculture value chains. This funding will enable the country, which has been undergoing rapid growth, to increase the sector's contribution to the blue economy, both nationally and locally.

Courtesy of this new project, fishing activities in coastal towns such as Sassandra will be able to expand significantly. The project will also help the establishment and implementation of integrated and participatory management plans for sea, lagoon and inland fisheries that prioritize small-scale commercial fishing species. World Leaders Climate Action Summit

12-13 November, Blue Zone, COP29



During the 2024 UN Climate Change Conference (UNFCCC COP 29), the Azerbaijani Presidency will host the World Leaders Climate Action Summit, convening world leaders to present national statements on how they are advancing the Paris Agreement on climate change. During the event, the Presidency will cohost a methane and non-carbon dioxide (non-CO2) greenhouse gas (GHG) summit with the US and China.

The Summit aims to build consensus and momentum around the COP 29 plan to enhance ambition and enable action and demonstrate to all stakeholders a clear political will to deliver. Leader dialogues will address raising ambition for mitigation and adaptation through nationally determined contributions (NDCs), National Adaptation Plans (NAPs), and long-term low-emission development strategies (LT-LEDS), enabling action with the New Collective Quantified Goal on Climate (NCQG), and other means of implementation and support.
